# SERMON TEXT:Mark 10:35-45 (ESV)

35 And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came up to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." 36 And he said to them, "What do you want me to do for you?" 37 And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." 38 Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" <sup>39</sup> And they said to him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized, 40 but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." 41 And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. 42 And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. <sup>43</sup> But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, 44 and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

# Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. Are you a glory seeker? Think through the four questions for identifying if you are a glory seeker, and apply them to your life. In what other ways do you seek glory?
  - A. Do you base your identity on your performance?
  - B. Do you constantly worry about what other people think of you?
  - C. Do you struggle with prayer, or with living like you are completely dependant on God?
  - D. Do you fantasize about status symbols?
- 2. In what ways have you used work, school, etc. as a vehicle for glorifying yourself? How has God graciously humbled you in these areas, and challenged the illusion of your glory?
- 3. How do you pursue status? In what concrete ways has the quest for status caused you to not love God and your neighbor as you should?
- 4. Read Isaiah 53:4-6, 11-12. According to this passage, how did Jesus serve us? How does vv. 11-12 identify his service as being glorious?
- 5. Husbands, fathers, mothers, employers, etc: what are some concrete ways that you can serve the people that God has placed under your leadership? How can you place their needs ahead of your own? How can you use your authority for their good?
