SERMON OUTLINE January 20, 2013

Sermon Series: Life Sunday Sermon: Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Sermon Title: *The Measure of our Mettle* Sermon Text: Proverbs 24:10-12

I. The right to be rescued

SERMON TEXT: Proverbs 24:10-12 (NIV)

¹⁰ If you falter in a time of trouble, how small is your strength! ¹¹ Rescue those being led away to death; hold back those staggering toward slaughter. ¹² If you say, "But we knew nothing about this," does not he who weighs the heart perceive it? Does not he who guards your life know it? Will he not repay everyone according to what they have done?

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. In v-10, we see that a person's strength is shown when adversity comes, and it is also "a subtle warning that if one neglects to use his faculties and strengths in crisis, they will be diminished by the failure of nerve"—Michael Fox
- 2. Consider: "Cowardice in the face of injustice is reprehensible." –R.E. Murphy "Exceptional strain and avoidable responsibility are fair tests of a man's mettle." –Derek Kidner
- 3. Often the reaction by Christians is to either despair of changing anything so they go into their comfortable bunkers isolated from the world, or they accommodate their beliefs to get along with the world and loose their prophetic voice to speak against sin in a culture. In what way does Jesus equip his Church to be in the world and yet not of the world?
- 4. The Bible continually speaks of protecting the powerless. What role do we have here in the Flathead to do that? How has the Lord challenged you personally to get involved? What are you doing about it?
- i. "Is the right to choose an absolute right? Do we have the moral right to choose what is morally wrong?... Again, every law enacted limits or restricts someone's choices. That is the very nature of law. If we do not wish to restrict other people's choices through legislation, we must stop legislating and cease voting...No unborn baby has ever had the right to choose or deny its own destruction." –R.C. Sproul
- 6. Consider Isaiah 40:29: He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.
