

SERMON TEXT:Isaiah 42:1-9 (ESV)

- ¹ Behold my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen, in whom my soul delights; I have put my Spirit upon him; he will bring forth justice to the nations.
- ² He will not cry aloud or lift up his voice, or make it heard in the street;
- ³ a bruised reed he will not break, and a faintly burning wick he will not quench; he will faithfully bring forth justice.
- ⁴ He will not grow faint or be discouraged till he has established justice in the earth; and the coastlands wait for his law.
- ⁵ Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people on it and spirit to those who walk in it:
- ⁶"I am the LORD; I have called you in righteousness; I will take you by the hand and keep you; I will give you as a covenant for the people, a light for the nations,
- ⁷ to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.
- ⁸ I am the LORD; that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to carved idols.
- ⁹ Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth I tell you of them."

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

1. How does Jesus bring justice to the nations? What does it mean to say: "the here and not yet"?

2. Why is the theme of justice so important here? Where do we see this evident in everyday life?

3. Why is having a "biblical anthropology" so essential?

4. How is our pride a key component of our blindness? How does humility give us our sight back?

5. To bring light infers that darkness is present—in what ways does the Church bring light to the world's darkness? How do we establish justice?

6. Where do you see the Lord calling you to humble yourself in your relationships to others?
