- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

SERMON TEXT: Job 3 (ESV)

¹ After this Job opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth. ² And Job said: ³ "Let the day perish on which I was born, and the night that said,'A man is conceived.' ⁴ Let that day be darkness! May God above not seek it, nor light shine upon it. ⁵ Let gloom and deep darkness claim it...⁷ Behold, let that night be barren; let no joyful cry enter it...⁹ Let the stars of its dawn be dark; let it hope for light, but have none, nor see the eyelids of the morning, ¹⁰ because it did not shut the doors of my mother's womb nor hide trouble from my eyes.

11 "Why did I not die at birth, come out from the womb and expire? 12 Why did the knees receive me? Or why the breasts, that I should nurse? 13 For then I would have lain down and been quiet; I would have slept; then I would have been at rest, ... 16 Or why was I not as a hidden stillborn child, as infants who never see the light? ¹⁷ There the wicked cease from troubling, and there the weary are at rest...¹⁹ The small and the great are there, and the slave is free from his master. ²⁰ "Why is light given to him who is in misery, and life to the bitter in soul, 21 who long for death, but it comes not, and dig for it more than for hidden treasures, ²² who rejoice exceedingly and are glad when they find the grave? ²³ Why is light given to a man whose way is hidden, whom God has hedged in? ²⁴ For my sighing comes instead of my bread, and my groanings are poured out like water. ²⁵ For the thing that I fear comes upon me, and what I dread befalls me. 26 I am not at ease, nor am I quiet; I have no rest, but trouble comes."

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. What surprises you about Job's speech? Consider: "Job is not trying to argue a point; he is trying to understand his experience."—F. Anderson
- 2. Job's speech is a well-crafted Hebrew poem. What are some applications we can draw from this when we consider dealing with our own sufferings?
- 3. How can a formal lament, song, poem, etc. provide 'banks' for our overflowing emotions? Consider: "Not only is form not a hindrance, but personal expression often strikes deeper when formed."
- 4. How is Genesis 1 and Job 3 similar?
- 5. Consider: "But not all grey words get their color from a black heart. Some are colored mainly by the pain, the despair. What you hear is not the deepest thing within. There is something real within where they come from. But it is temporary-like a passing infection-real, painful, but not the true person."-Piper
- 6. What are some helpful ways you could bring comfort to someone expressing thoughts like Job? What might be things to avoid?
- 7. When dealing with our own dark thoughts, how does Jesus bring us comfort?
