OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. Why is Job 28 called "a brilliant but embarrassing poem for many commentators"? Why are scholars both "impressed and perplexed by its contents"?
- 2. Consider: "In the first part of his soliloquy, Job concedes that wisdom cannot be found by searching for its source in any place on earth. In the second part, he stipulates that wisdom cannot be acquired second-hand through commercial transactions. This second observation, like the first, invites Job (and the reader) to search for meaning at more than one level." Samuel Balentine
- 3. What is the difference between what God and humans can acquire when they go in search of wisdom?
- 4. How do we learn what it is that God wants us to know?
- 5. Consider: "Faith in God is and must be the basis of our viewing and bearing our sorrows, our disappointments, and our trials in life or we are bound to go wrong. What faith? Faith that God is in control, that he knows what he is doing, that all his purposes are good and righteous altogether, and that while sorrow may last through the night joy will come in the morning. Only the Christian can know this ... We must live, even in the darkness of life, looking up to the one who knows all, who rules over all, and whose ways, while past our finding out, are designed for our everlasting good!" Dr. Rayburn
- 6. Wisdom must move from reflection to action. It is the art of living a godly life. In what way is the Lord prompting you to wise action?
- 7. What role does our own powerlessness have in obtaining wisdom?

SERMON TEXT Job 28 (ESV)

¹ "Surely there is a mine for silver, and a place for gold that they refine. ² Iron is taken out of the earth, and copper is smelted from the ore. ³ Man puts an end to darkness and searches out to the farthest limit the ore in gloom and deep darkness. ⁴ He opens shafts in a valley away from where anyone lives... ⁹ "Man puts his hand to the flinty rock and overturns mountains by the roots...

¹² "But where shall wisdom be found? And where is the place of understanding?

¹³ Man does not know its worth and it is not found in the land of the living...¹⁵ It cannot be bought for gold, and silver cannot be weighed as its price. ¹⁶ It cannot be valued in the gold of Ophir, in precious onyx or sapphire...
