OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit
 and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation
 of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and
 practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. God asks Job three questions: Who are you? Where were you? Are you able? Job gives three responses: I am nothing, I was not there, I am not able. How is this helpful for Job?
- 2. "What do words about snow, rain, ice, clouds, and ostriches have to do with Job's suffering? As Clifford Edwards observes, "One is tempted to paraphrase God as saying, 'I may not be much at psychology and human relations, but I am great at meteorology and zoology." Balentine. How would you respond to this?
- 3. Consider: "God's appearance dissolves Job's questions in the same way the presence of a loved one whom we have suspected of betrayal can dissolve suspicion. Once the loved one appears, all doubts vanish."
- 4. There are 60 nouns and verbs from Job's curse in ch. 3 that are repeated in the Lord's speeches in ch. 38-42. With multiple repetitions, the number goes up to 140. "Every verse in Job's curse has at least one verbal echo in God's speech, and most have multiple echoes." David Dorsey. In all the areas that Job considered mistakes in his being born, God proclaims his infinite understanding and kind authority.
- 5. Consider: "Job, I alone know all about everything, from beginning to end, including the seemingly mistaken events of your birth, your life, and your present suffering. And everything is ultimately under my good and wise control. Even in regard to your present suffering, I know all about it; I am in control of it; and I intend only good through it. I do not make mistakes." Dorsey
- 6. The Lord changes the question from what Job and his friends have been asking. God is expanding Job's horizon by showing Job's ignorance and littleness. How is this helpful to Job?
- 7. In what way does the coming of Jesus help answer some of Job's questions?

LORD'S SUPPER OBSERVANCE

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience. The wine is located in the two outer rings and the juice is located in the center ring.

SERMON TEXT Job 38-42 (ESV)

38:1 Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind and said:

² "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge?

³ Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. ⁴ "Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. ⁵ Who determined its measurements—surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it?....¹⁸ Have you comprehended the expanse of the earth? Declare, if you know all this.... ³⁴ "Can you lift up your voice to the clouds, that a flood of waters may cover you? ³⁵ Can you send forth lightnings, that they may go and say to you, 'Here we are'?

39:26 "Is it by your understanding that the hawk soars and spreads his wings toward the south?

40:1 And the Lord said to Job: ² "Shall a faultfinder contend with the Almighty? He who argues with God, let him answer it." ³ Then Job answered the Lord and said: ⁴ "Behold, I am of small account; what shall I answer you? I lay my hand on my mouth. ⁵ I have spoken once, and I will not answer; twice, but I will proceed no further." ⁶ Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind and said: ⁷ "Dress for action like a man; I will question you, and you make it known to me. ⁸ Will you even put me in the wrong? Will you condemn me that you may be in the right? ⁹ Have you an arm like God, and can you thunder with a voice like his?

41:1 Can you draw out Leviathan with a fishhook or press down his tongue with a cord?

42:1 Then Job answered the Lord and said: ² "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. ³ 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. ⁴ 'Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you make it known to me.' ⁵ I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; ⁶ therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes."
