OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit
 and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation
 of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and
 practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- 1. Why are the Minor Prophets such "fly over states" for many Christians?
- 2. What does "the Day of the Lord" refer to?
- 3. Consider: "We Christians sometimes believe that the cross will always shield us from similar condemnation, but there is no automatic guarantee in the gospel of Christ against such death. Where the worship of his Lordship becomes mixed with allegiance to other lords, where there is belief that luck or the stars or the powers of this world ultimately control our destiny, where we therefore neglect the worship of the Lord and conform to the ways of society and water down his commands for convenience for ideological servitude, we too are confronted by a God who can say to us, "I will utterly sweep away everything from the face of the earth." And perhaps in this nuclear age we have had a glimpse of the instruments of that sweeping."—Achtemeier
- 4. A famous poem (Dies irae) was written in the 13th century using verses 14-18. It was widely used in liturgy and translated into multiple languages. Today it is little known and used. What are some reasons for the cultural shift regarding God's judgment?
- 5. In what way is 2:3 a key verse in this prophecy of judgment?
- 6. How does the coming of Christ both soften the hard edge of this judgment as well as harden and sharpen it?

SERMON TEXT Zephaniah 1:1-2:3 (ESV)

- 1:1 The word of the LORD that came to Zephaniah the son of Cushi, son of Gedaliah, son of Amariah, son of Hezekiah, in the days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah.
- ² "I will utterly sweep away everything from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.
- ³ "I will sweep away man and beast; I will sweep away the birds of the heavens and the fish of the sea, and the rubble with the wicked. I will cut off mankind from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.
- ⁴ "I will stretch out my hand against Judah and against all the inhabitants of Jerusalem; and I will cut off from this place the remnant of Baal and the name of the idolatrous priests along with the priests,
