OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion, continued

- 2. The Bible's instruction regarding outer adornment is a good example of what it means to hold truths in tension. Outer adornment is spoken of as positive (Gen 24:53, Ezk 16:1-13; Isa 61:10; Song 1:10-11, Song 4:9), and outer adornment is warned against (Isa 3:16;1 Tim 2:9, Titus 2:5; 1 Pet 3:3). Both teachings have their right place in the lives of God's people. How has holding to one truth to the exclusion of the other been problematic on this issue?
- 3. Peter's instruction here to women with unbelieving husbands contains an evangelistic purpose. In light of their circumstances, they have an opportunity to endure difficulty for the sake of begin a witness to Christ. How might you encourage someone in this position based on what Peter has been saying in ch. 2? Consider also that the respect mentioned in v-2 is to be directed at the Lord.
- 4. Men and women are equally made in God's image (Gen 1:26-27). They have equal access to salvation in Christ (Gal 3:28). We also know that there are differences between the genders that are more than biological. How does Jesus' submission to the Father combine these aspects of unity and diversity that should be the model for men and women? (Cf. 1 Cor 15:27-28; Phil 2:6; Eph 5:25-33)
- 5. Vs. 6 refers to Gen. 18:12 where Sarah refers to Abraham as her lord (it is not a direct address). This is reference for respect, many different classes of people were called 'lord' similar to our saying 'sir'.
- 6. Consider: "Wives should be subject to their husbands, not from dread and amazement, but from desire to do well, and please God. The husband's duty to the wife implies giving due respect unto her, and maintaining her authority, protecting her, and placing trust in her. They are heirs together of all the blessings of this life and that which is to come, and should live peaceably one with another. Prayer sweetens their converse." Matthew Henry
- 7. In what way can prayers be hindered? How is Peter's command for husbands to honor wives completely unique in his day?
- 8. If the word submission is used repeatedly in your home, you likely do not have a biblical view of what it means. If any idea of submission is relegated to "cultural differences not applicable for today" then you likely do not have a biblical view of submission. How does the gospel inform our views of submission?

SERMON TEXT 1 Peter 3:1-7 (ESV)

¹ Likewise, wives, be subject to your own husbands, so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives, ² when they see your respectful and pure conduct. ³ Do not let your adorning be external--the braiding of hair and the putting on of gold jewelry, or the clothing you wear-- ⁴ but let your adorning be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious. ⁵ For this is how the holy women who hoped in God used to adorn themselves, by submitting to their own husbands, ⁶ as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord. And you are her children, if you do good and do not fear anything that is frightening. ¹ Likewise, husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman as the weaker vessel, since they are heirs with you of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

1. Peter's instruction here is to wives in particular, not to women in general. (cf Eph. 5:22-23; Col. 3:18; Titus 2:4-5). Consider this following:

What Submission Is Not: (based on 1 Peter 3:1-6) — John Piper 1. Submission does not mean agreeing with everything your husband says.

- 2. Submission does not mean leaving your brain or your will at the wedding altar.
- 3. Submission does not mean avoiding every effort to change a husband.
- 4. Submission does not mean putting the will of the husband before the will of Christ.
- 5. Submission does not mean that a wife gets her personal, spiritual strength primarily through her husband.
- 6. Finally, submission does not mean that a wife is to act out of fear.

What is Submission: — John Piper

"Submission is the divine calling of a wife to honor and affirm her husband's leadership and help carry it through according to her gifts. It's the disposition to follow a husband's authority and an inclination to yield to his leadership. It is an attitude that says, "I delight for you to take the initiative in our family. I am glad when you take responsibility for things and lead with love. I don't flourish in the relationship when you are passive and I have to make sure the family works."
