OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. Michal begins with great love toward David, but by the end her heart is filled with contempt toward him. Even if hard things happened to her along the way, what are some ways that she could have help to guard her heart against contempt?
- 2. How did Saul's sin continue to effect the life of his daughter Michal?
- 3. Consider: "Contempt is a form of anger. It ups the ante, intensifying our fight or flight exponentially ... It isolates us as unlovable, withering our hope for love ... A poison that that paralyzes our deepest longing for love and meaning, stripping us of hope."—D. Allender, T. Longman. Give an example of where you have seen contempt at work? Did it resemble this description?
- 4. Is there anything surprising you find about this quote: "Mercy is hard to endure. In fact. mercy is harder to receive than contempt. Both contempt and mercy strip away pretense and expose the heart, but mercy offers the exposed soul the opportunity to embrace desire and hope. For many, the prospect of hope is too great a desire to bear." Longman and Allender
- 5. In 2 Sam. 6:16, Michal is introduced not as David's wife, but as the daughter of Saul. What might some reasons for this be? How is the closing line in 2 Sam. 6:23 a continuation of God's judgment on Saul?
- 6. What about the mercy of Christ can keep our hearts from the devastation of contempt? How has this been a challenge for you? How would you encourage others in the gospel in their struggles against contempt?

November 2, 2014 Sermon: Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Sermon Series: David - The Early Years Sermon Title: *Sliding into Contempt*

I. A misused pawn can still be a queen.

II. Keeping a heart free from mockery and contempt.

SERMON TEXT

1 Samuel 18:20-30 (ESV)

²⁰ Now Saul's daughter Michal loved David. And they told Saul, and the thing pleased him. ²¹ Saul thought, "Let me give her to him, that she may be a snare for him and that the hand of the Philistines may be against him." Therefore Saul said to David a second time, ... And Saul gave him his daughter Michal for a wife. ²⁸ But when Saul saw and knew that the Lord was with David, and that Michal, Saul's daughter, loved him, ²⁹ Saul was even more afraid of David. So Saul was David's enemy continually. ³⁰ Then the commanders of the Philistines came out to battle, and as often as they came out David had more success than all the servants of Saul, so that his name was highly esteemed.

1 Samuel 25:44

Saul had given Michal his daughter, David's wife, to Palti the son of Laish, who was of Gallim.

2 Samuel 3:14

Then David sent messengers to Ish-bosheth, Saul's son, saying, "Give me my wife Michal, for whom I paid the bridal price of a hundred foreskins of the Philistines." ¹⁵ And Ish-bosheth sent and took her from her husband Paltiel the son of Laish. ¹⁶ But her husband went with her, weeping after her all the way to Bahurim. Then Abner said to him, "Go, return." And he returned.

2 Samuel 6:16

As the ark of the Lord came into the city of David, Michal the daughter of Saul looked out of the window and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord, and she despised him in her heart ...²⁰ And David returned to bless his household. But Michal the daughter of Saul came out to meet David and said, "How the king of Israel honored himself today, uncovering himself today before the eyes of his servants' female servants, as one of the vulgar fellows shamelessly uncovers himself!" ²¹ And David said to Michal, "It was before the Lord, who chose me above your father and above all his house, to appoint me as prince over Israel, the people of the Lord—and I will celebrate before the Lord. ²² I will make myself yet more contemptible than this, and I will be abased in your eyes. But by the female servants of whom you have spoken, by them I shall be held in honor." ²³ And Michal the daughter of Saul had no child to the day of her death.
