OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit
 and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation
 of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and
 practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. In responding to the question of fasting, Jesus says that his current ministry is to be marked by joy. When you read the gospels, do you sense this joy? If not, what might that say about your understanding of Jesus' ministry?
- 2. How does Jesus' example of David answer the Pharisee's objection?
- 3. The Jewish people at this time had created a complex sets of rules and regulations on keeping the Sabbath that went far beyond Scripture. Adding to what the Lord says or taking away from what the Lord says, even for seemingly noble reasons, can lead us down a very dangerous path. What are some evangelical "good ideas" that have become like the Pharisees' extra-Sabbath rules?
- 4. Jesus did not come to abolish the Sabbath. How have many people misused Jesus teaching on the Sabbath to simply justify doing what they want?
- 5. This is the second time Luke uses "the Son of Man" (Lk 5:24, 6:5) How do these two usages continue to build on answering the question "who is Jesus"?
- 6. Looking at these three different conflicts, what do you see about the nature of who Jesus is and what he came to do as a great encouragement for you right now?

Sermon: Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Sermon Series: Facing Jerusalem - Luke Sermon Title: *Lord of the Sabbath*

SERMON TEXT Luke 5:33-6:11 (ESV)

5:33 And they said to him, "The disciples of John fast often and offer prayers, and so do the disciples of the Pharisees, but yours eat and drink." ³⁴ And Jesus said to them, "Can you make wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is with them? ³⁵ The days will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them, and then they will fast in those days." ³⁶ He also told them a parable: "No one tears a piece from a new garment and puts it on an old garment. If he does, he will tear the new, and the piece from the new will not match the old. ³⁷ And no one puts new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the new wine will burst the skins and it will be spilled, and the skins will be destroyed. ³⁸ But new wine must be put into fresh wineskins. ³⁹ And no one after drinking old wine desires new, for he says, 'The old is good."

6:1 On a Sabbath, while he was going through the grainfields, his disciples plucked and ate some heads of grain, rubbing them in their hands. ² But some of the Pharisees said, "Why are you doing what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath?" ³ And Jesus answered them, "Have you not read what David did when he was hungry, he and those who were with him: ⁴ how he entered the house of God and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and also gave it to those with him?" ⁵ And he said to them, "The Son of Man is lord of the Sabbath."

⁶ On another Sabbath, he entered the synagogue and was teaching, and a man was there whose right hand was withered.

⁷ And the scribes and the Pharisees watched him, to see whether he would heal on the Sabbath, so that they might find a reason to accuse him. ⁸ But he knew their thoughts, and he said to the man with the withered hand, "Come and stand here." And he rose and stood there. ⁹ And Jesus said to them, "I ask you, is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save life or to destroy it?" ¹⁰ And after looking around at them all he said to him, "Stretch out your hand." And he did so, and his hand was restored.
