OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three . persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's • displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as • individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and ٠ to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under . the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

1. In what way does this text show that Jesus does not need people who will direct him, but people that will serve him. How do you see this in your life?

2. Consider: "Peter's confession becomes his resume for service. Humility is the elevator to spiritual greatness." — Daniel Bock.

3. Mendel Nun, a fisherman and expert on the Sea of Galilee, tells us that the disciples where using trammel nets. The shore line was too rocky for drag nets in this region. This type of fishing was done at night so that fish would not see the linen netting. They also had to be washed and dried out to prevent rotting. This was done early in the morning when the boats came to shore. How do these incidental details help us understand the carefulness of the gospel writers in getting the facts from first hand accounts? If these stories where made up much later, would this level of detail have likely been included?

4. How does Peter's response to Jesus' power contrast with the people of Capernaum in 4:42? What is a proper response to the ministry of Jesus?

5. Compare Isaiah's encounter with the Lord in Isaiah 6:1-10. What are the similarities?

6. What does it mean to be fully committed even if you are not yet fully informed?

SERMON TEXT Luke 5:1-11 (ESV)

¹ On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, ² and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³ Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴ And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." ⁶ And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking.⁷ They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink.⁸ But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." 9 For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." ¹¹ And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.
