OUR STATEMENT OF FAITH

The Presbyterian Church in America or "The PCA" is a distinctly evangelical denomination in the Reformed tradition. The Bible as the Word of God is the primary standard for our faith. The Westminster Confession of Faith and Catechisms, although subordinate to the Bible in their authority, set forth our understanding of biblical truth in a consistent, concise, and reliable form. In the Reformed tradition, there are five key tenets, among others, that we hold to: By Scripture Alone; By Christ Alone; By Grace Alone; By Faith Alone; and To God Alone be the Glory.

- We believe the Bible is the written word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit
 and without error in the original manuscripts. The Bible is the revelation
 of God's truth and is infallible and authoritative in all matters of faith and
 practice.
- We believe in the Holy Trinity. There is one God, who exists eternally in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- We believe that all are sinners and totally unable to save themselves from God's displeasure, except by His mercy.
- We believe that salvation is by God alone as He sovereignly chooses those He will save. We believe His choice is based on His grace, not on any human individual merit, or foreseen faith.
- We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, who through His perfect life and sacrificial death atoned for the sins of all who will trust in Him, alone, for salvation.
- We believe that God is gracious and faithful to His people not simply as individuals but as families in successive generations according to His Covenant promises.
- We believe that the Holy Spirit indwells God's people and gives them the strength and wisdom to trust Christ and follow Him.
- We believe that Jesus will return, bodily and visibly, to judge all mankind and to receive His people to Himself.
- We believe that all aspects of our lives are to be lived to the glory of God under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Questions for Reflection and Discussion

- 1. This text shows us the difference between how Jesus and the Pharisees related to real sinners. It is incredibly easy to look down on those Pharisees who did not like "sinners" even while we do the same thing. What is the danger of 'under' identifying with sinners? What is the danger of 'over' identifying with sinners (i.e. acknowledging brokenness but not calling for repentance)?
- 2. Luke's anointing passage is a different event than a similar one described by the other gospel writers (Matt 26:6-13; Mk 14:309; Jn 12:1-8). What details from the text shows us this?
- 3. Simon extended to Jesus an ordinary courtesy (it would be an overstatement to say that he had been rude). The woman extended an extraordinary courtesy. What she did required great humility. Why was this lacking in Simon? What warning do you see for yourself?
- 4. Consider: "Faith expresses itself in love, gratitude, and devotion. Faith yields the fruit of forgiveness, which leads to the fruit of action."—Darrel Bock
- 5. Luke takes us right back to the question: "Who is this Jesus?" Could you answer this question through the eyes of the woman and understand her response?
- 6. Simon did not have faith, because he did not have love. How are we to combine the intellectual truths of Christ together with our affective response?

SERMON TEXT Luke 7:36-50 (ESV)

³⁶ One of the Pharisees asked him to eat with him, and he went into the Pharisee's house and took his place at the table. ³⁷ And behold, a woman of the city, who was a sinner, when she learned that he was reclining at table in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster flask of ointment, 38 and standing behind him at his feet, weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head and kissed his feet and anointed them with the ointment. ³⁹ Now when the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would have known who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, for she is a sinner." 40 And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it, Teacher."

⁴¹ "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. 42 When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" ⁴³ Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt."
