Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. Why is Jesus's second coming a central part of the Christian faith? How does his return give meaning to history?
- 2. People are often fearful when they discuss the end times (eschatology). If some end times teaching causes us to fear and go into a bunker, can we evaluate that teaching as deficient? Why should we be hopeful? How does the teaching of Jesus drive us out of a bunker mentality?
- 3. Consider: "If you want to start a debate, simply ask a group of Christians to explain what the Bible has to say about church government. If you want to start a shouting match, ask them what the Bible has to say about the second coming of Jesus...While most professing Christians agree on the fact of the second coming, virtually everything about it is debated."

- 4. Consider: "Every worship service is a sign that Jesus now reigns in sovereign grace and will return in glorious splendor." —Dennis Johnson. Why is this important?
- 5. Consider: "The events of sacred history are not self-explanatory but require the Word of God to interpret the revelatory character of the acts of God. The Bible is both the record of these events and the inspired interpretation of the divinely intended meaning of these events." —G.E. Ladd

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Isaiah 58:13-14
