# Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. When Jonathan Edwards was 19, he came up with a list of 70 resolutions that he wanted to live by. His opening remarks were: "Being sensible that I am unable to do anything without God's help, I do humbly entreat him by his grace to enable me to keep these resolutions, so far as they are agreeable to his will for Christ's sake." - 5. What is the danger of moralism in making resolutions? How do we get past this or can we?
- 6. How do we not make this all about us? What is the role of the Church and Christ's glory in our sanctification?
