PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 Corinthians 6:9-11

Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor men who practice homosexuality, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. Sermon Questions For Further Reflection

- 1. The universal interpretation of chapter 8 is that the large horn in vs 9-25 is the Seleucid ruler, Antiochus IV Epiphanes. So much so, that many are convinced Daniel was written after these events took place. Why is predictive prophecy not a problem for Christians?
- 2. In all of the visions, we see the repetitive cycle of violence. Same song, different verse. In what powerful way does Jesus break this cycle of violence in his own death?
- 3. At the time of this vision, Babylon is still the big guy on the block. It would have surprised many to think that the smaller kingdoms of Media, Persia and Greece would become significant empires. How should that temper our desire for making predictions?
- 4. The idea that a larger cosmic battle takes place behind the background of human conflict will be seen in later chapters. Yet how does this help give us perspective in chapter 8?
- 5. From 1945 to 1994, one scholar documented over 200 precise predictions of the return of Christ. Why do many get so upset when their view of the end times is challenged? What about the nature of "we've got it right" causes such a reaction?
- 6. There is no universal agreement on the 2,300 days and evenings mentioned in vs 14. What are two lessons can we draw from this?
- 7. How do the tragedies of our lives draw us closer to the Lord knowing he is in control and that he has the final say? In what way are you called to greater faithfulness in the midst of these trials?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

God Cleanses Us

Daniel - Living in Babylon Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Times & Dates - Daniel 8:1-27 (ESV)

¹ In the third year of King Belshazzar's reign, I, Daniel, had a vision, after the one that had already appeared to me. ³ I looked up, and there before me was a ram with two horns, One of the horns was longer than the other but grew up later... No animal could stand against it...It did as it pleased and became great. 5 As I was thinking about this, suddenly a goat with a prominent horn between its eyes came from the west, crossing the whole earth without touching the ground... I saw it attack the ram furiously, striking the ram and shattering its two horns. The ram was powerless to stand against it; ...and none could rescue the ram from its power. ⁸ The goat became very great, but at the height of its power the large horn was broken off, and in its place four prominent horns grew up toward the four winds of heaven. ⁹ Out of one of them came another horn,... ¹⁰ It grew until it reached the host of the heavens, and it threw some of the starry host down to the earth and trampled on them. ¹¹ It set itself up to be as great as the commander of the army of the LORD; it took away the daily sacrifice from the LORD, and his sanctuary was thrown down. 12 Because of rebellion, the LORD's people and the daily sacrifice were given over to it. It prospered in everything it did, and truth was thrown to the ground. 13 Then I heard a holy one speaking, and another holy one said to him, "How long will it take for the vision to be fulfilled-the vision concerning the daily sacrifice, the rebellion that causes desolation, the surrender of the sanctuary and the trampling underfoot of the LORD's people?" ¹⁴ He said to me, "It will take 2,300 evenings and mornings; then the sanctuary will be reconsecrated."

While I, Daniel, was watching the vision and trying to understand it, there before me stood one who looked like a man. ¹⁶ And I heard a man's voice..., "Gabriel, tell this man the meaning of the vision."..."Son of man," he said to me, "understand that the vision concerns the time of the end."...

¹⁹ He said: "I am going to tell you what will happen later in the time of wrath, because the vision concerns the appointed time of the end. ²⁰ The two-horned ram that you saw represents the kings of Media and Persia. ²¹ The shaggy goat is the king of Greece, and the large horn between its eyes is the first king. ²² The four horns that replaced the one that was broken off represent four kingdoms that will emerge from his nation but will not have the same power. ²³ ...a fierce-looking king, a master of intrigue, will arise. ²⁴ He will become very strong...He will cause astounding devastation and will succeed in whatever he does. He will destroy those who are mighty, the holy people. ²⁵ He will cause deceit to prosper, and he will consider himself superior. When they feel secure, he will destroy many and take his stand against the Prince of princes. Yet he will be destroyed, but not by human power.
