Sermon Questions For Further Reflection

- 1. Psalm 121 is considered a pilgrim's psalm on the way to Jerusalem. How does thinking of this as a traveler's psalm help inform our living life here and now? (Read 1 Peter 2:11)
- 2. Consider: "We Christians do not like to think about being absolutely helpless in the hands of our God. With all of our faith, and with all of His grace, we still prefer to maintain some semblance of control over our lives."—Mike Mason
- 3. In reading 2 Cor. 11:23-29, we see that Paul struggled under greater hardships as a Christian than when he was not. How do we line this up with Psalm 121?
- 4. Consider: "The Christian life is not a quiet escape to a garden where we can walk and talk uninterruptedly with our Lord; nor a fantasy trip to a heavenly city where we can compare blue ribbons and gold medals with others who have made it to the winners circle ... The Christian life is going to God. In going to God Christians travel the same ground that everyone else walks on, breath the same air, drink the same water, shop in the same stores ... fear the same dangers, are subject to the same pressures, get the same distresses, are buried in the same ground."—Eugene Peterson
- 5. Every time a sleep, I prove once more that I am not God. What comfort do we gain from a sovereign God who does sleep on the watch? What problems can this cause in the midst of suffering?
- 6. How is Jesus the fulfillment of the promises given here in Psalm 121? (read John 16:33)

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

The Lord's Supper The gospel is

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
