COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Titus 3:1-2

Remind them to be submissive to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready for every good work, to speak evil of no one, to avoid quarreling, to be gentle, and to show perfect courtesy toward all people.

All: Holy and righteous Father, I confess that you alone are good. Forgive me, O Lord, for speaking evil against those you have placed in authority over me; while I may have shown outward obedience, my heart has often been in rebellion against them. I have not been ready for every good work, nor have I avoided quarrels, but at times I have even delighted in them. Forgive me for not being gentle and kind. Lord, I was once foolish, disobedient, led astray, a slave to various passions and pleasures, passing my days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating in return; but because of Jesus, I no longer have to live like that. Father, please make me more like him in every way. (*Adapted from Titus 3:1-3*)

Call to Confession

We all sin daily, in thought and word and deed.
As we come into God's presence, we acknowledge how we have rebelled against our King and seek his forgiveness.

DECLARATION OF GRACE: Titus 3:4-7

Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. Paul is unfolding what he had just written about putting off the old self and putting on the new self in Jesus. In the last section (4:25-5:2), Paul spoke of what Christians should put on. Here, he speaks of what we should put off. What are the motivations Paul gives for living rightly?
- 2. We starve a cold and feed a fever. Here Paul tells us to starve lusts and feed praise (v-4b). How does this help?
- 3. What does Paul mean by becoming partners with those who do such shameful sins (v-7)? Read 1 Cor 10:19-21. Is there an overlap in the understanding of partnership between engaging in pagan sacrifices and engaging in shameful sins with sinners?
- 4. How would you respond to someone who might say this type of holy living is impossible and is not healthy?
- 5. There are about 80 references in Paul's letters to judgment. Salvation only makes sense in reference to being saved from something. When some remove God's wrath from the gospel, how does this fundamentally change the message of the gospel?
- 6. Paul speaks of a lifestyle, of a continued participation in sinful behavior that endangers us. Why?
- 7. What makes biblical purity so beautiful and wonderful?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
