COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Ephesians 5:3-6

But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints. Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving. For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience.

Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. Possibly one third of the Roman empire were slaves. In what ways did ancient slavery differ from slavery in the American south? How were they similar?
- 2. The message of the gospel carries in it the seeds of slavery's destruction. How is this so?
- 3. Working for the Lord speaks of a motivation that governs our actions. How is this an encouragement regardless of our circumstances? Read 1 Peter 2:18-25. Christians have a higher calling because we bear Jesus' name. How would you encourage a believer who struggles with suffering for righteousness in the work place?
- 4. What does "do the same to them" mean in v-9? Do the same what?
- 5. How does our work demonstrate the reality of the gospel in our lives? How does moralism trip us up in our service to others?

Sermon

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

*ON JORDAN'S STORMY BANKS I STAND
