Sermon Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. Some think of parables as quaint illustrations. However, Jesus said they were a form of judgment for unbelief (Mt 13:10-15). Why do you think many do not consider this as a part of intent of the parables?
- 2. What does it mean that the parables require a greater commitment from disciples? What is hidden about the kingdom?
- 3. Consider: "Money will not buy salvation. It is a gift of God (Isa 55:1). We can "buy" it only in the sense that we gain rightful possession of it. We do this by grace, through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, realizing that even that faith is God's gift (Eph 2:8)"—W. Hendriksen. How are both parables a display of grace?
- 4. Some find the kingdom by accident, others by a careful search. It's value is not dependent on the finder, but upon the kingdom itself. What do these different ways of finding it tell us about God's mysterious ways of working with fallen humanity? How does this keep us from making salvation a formula?
- 5. In what way is Paul an example of the parable of the treasure in the field? (Cf Phil 3:8-9, Acts 7:56-60). How is Cornelius an example of the pearl parable? (Acts 10:1-8, also the Ethiopian eunuch Acts 8:26-38).
- 6. How are joy and gratitude related to grace?

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
