## Lamentations: A Liturgy of Grief Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Look, O Lord, and See – Lamentations 2:1-22 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> How the Lord in his anger has set the daughter of Zion under a cloud! He has cast down from heaven to earth the splendor of Israel; he has not remembered his footstool in the day of his anger.

<sup>3</sup> He has cut down in fierce anger all the might of Israel; he has withdrawn from them his right hand in the face of the enemy; he has burned like a flaming fire in Jacob, consuming all around.

- <sup>5</sup>The Lord has become like an enemy; he has swallowed up Israel; he has swallowed up all its palaces; he has laid in ruins its strongholds, and he has multiplied in the daughter of Judah mourning and lamentation.
- <sup>11</sup> My eyes are spent with weeping; my stomach churns; my bile is poured out to the ground because of the destruction of the daughter of my people, because infants and babies faint in the streets of the city.

<sup>12</sup> They cry to their mothers, "Where is bread and wine?" as they faint like a wounded man in the streets of the city, as their life is poured out on their mothers' bosom.

<sup>14</sup> Your prophets have seen for you false and deceptive visions; they have not exposed your iniquity to restore your fortunes, but have seen for you oracles that are false and misleading.

<sup>17</sup> The LORD has done what he purposed; he has carried out his word, which he commanded long ago; he has thrown down without pity; he has made the enemy rejoice over you and exalted the might of your foes.

19 "Arise, cry out in the night, at the beginning of the night watches! Pour out your heart like water before the presence of the Lord! Lift your hands to him for the lives of your children, who faint for hunger at the head of every street."

#### Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

#### **Sermon Questions**

- 1. Lamentations 2 expresses greater intensity than chapter 1. It seems to ask the question "Does Judah's punishment fit the crime?" The poet does not answer the question. Why do you think this question is implied?
- 2. This chapter informs us that fidelity to the Lord is more important than Israel's presence as a religious community. The Lord's patience has a limit. How does this keep us from presumption in our own lives?
- 3. In what way does our understanding of covenant help to interpret the events that occurred to God's people? How does this also point us to the new covenant?
- 4. Consider: "Directing a lament to God is an acknowledgment of God's power over the circumstances of life. It also suggests some degree of confidence that God will do something to remedy a situation beyond human control."—Dianne Bergant. How is a lament a humble expression of faith?
- 5. How do you bring comfort to someone who has suffered due to their own mistakes? How does the gospel enable us to do so?

## The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

#### CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

#### PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
