COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Ephesians 5:3-6

But sexual immorality and all impurity or covetousness must not even be named among you, as is proper among saints. Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving. For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. Palm Sunday Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. The Way of Jesus – John 12:12-26 (ESV)

¹²The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

¹⁵ "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. ¹⁷ The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸ The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. ²¹ So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²² Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³ And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

Sermon Questions

- 1. What message does Jesus communicate by coming in on a donkey? Why did the people and the disciples not understand the significance (cf. v16)?
- 2. Theophylact, an early church writer, acknowledges the divinity of Jesus taught in this text. "Only God has the power to save, and to Jesus they cry out 'Save us O Lord our God' (Ps 105:45). Many other passages in Scripture ascribe to God alone the power to save. The Psalms of David most clearly refer to the Christ as true God."
- 3. Why does Jesus connect the request of the Greeks to see him with "the hour has come"? (So far in John, "the hour" has always been a future reference. That changes here.)
- 4. Reading verse 23, how does Jesus bring glory to himself?
- 5. When you think of laying down your life for Jesus, what does this mean for you where you are currently at?

Sermon
