COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 51:5-6, 16-17

Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me. Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart...For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering. DECLARATION OF GRACE: Psalm 23:1-4

*SCRIPTURAL CONFESSION OF FAITH: Colossians 1:15-20

And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. ¹ How the gold has grown dim, how the pure gold is changed! The holy stones lie scattered at the head of every street.

⁴ The tongue of the nursing infant sticks to the roof of its mouth for thirst;

the children beg for food, but no one gives to them.

⁵ Those who once feasted on delicacies perish in the streets; those who were brought up in purple embrace ash heaps.

⁶ For the chastisement of the daughter of my people has been greater than the punishment of Sodom, which was overthrown in a moment, and no hands were wrung for her.

⁷ Her princes were purer than snow, whiter than milk; their bodies were more ruddy than coral, the beauty of their form was like sapphire.

⁸ Now their face is blacker than soot; they are not recognized in the streets; their skin has shriveled on their bones; it has become as dry as wood.

⁹ Happier were the victims of the sword than the victims of hunger, who wasted away, pierced by lack of the fruits of the field.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

- 1. The power of this poem comes from its series of contrasts to the way things were to what they are now. What value is there in doing this? (Keep in minds that it is one part of five poems).
- 2. This poem expresses the pain of all the different classes of people in the city of Jerusalem. There are no "I" statements, only "We".
- 3. The people of God are not asked to stuff or deny their emotions. How does a biblical lament enable us to do so rightly?
- 4. Consider: "Do not pry too curiously into the secrets of Providence, nor allow your shallow reason arrogantly to judge and censure its designs." —John Flavel (1628-1691). Why is this a good reminder for us?
- 5. How are the responses of the leadership before the fall in sharp contrast to the leaders of Nineveh in the book of Jonah? In what ways can we be presumptuous as Christians?
- 6. Where do we find our dignity in suffering? How does the gospel provide real hope in very bad circumstances?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

(Chorus)

By thy mercy, O deliver us, good Lord By thy mercy, O deliver us, good Lord, good Lord.

When temptation sorely presses, in the day of Satan's power, In our times of deep distresses, in each dark and trying hour. When the world around is smiling, in the time of wealth and ease, Earthly joys our hearts beguiling, in the day of health and peace. (Chorus)

In the weary hours of sickness, in the times of grief and pain, When we feel our mortal weakness, when all human help is vain. In the solemn hour of dying, in the awful judgment day, May our souls, on thee relying, find thee still our Rock and Stay. (Chorus 2x)

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
