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Series on Mark: Who is this Jesus? Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. The Authority of Jesus - Mark 1:21-28 (ESV)

²¹ And they went into Capernaum, and immediately on the Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching. ²² And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. ²³ And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, ²⁴ "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God." ²⁵ But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" ²⁶ And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying out with a loud voice, came out of him. ²⁷ And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." ²⁸ And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Mark highlights the power of Jesus' teaching throughout his gospel. The exorcism of the demon was a demonstration of his teaching authority. Or as one writer has said: "Jesus' word is deed." What problems occur when the miracles of Jesus are separated from the teaching of Jesus?
- 2. What are we to make of the power encounters that accompany Jesus as he ministers? How does this relate to his message of the kingdom of God being at hand?
- 3. Mark is careful to distinguish between those who are sick and those who are possessed. How might you respond to someone who thinks demonic beings are superstitious holdovers from the ancient world?
- 4. Why do you think Jesus forbid the demon to speak about him?
- 5. What is often "described" in Scripture is not necessarily "prescribed" in Scripture. What challenges do we face in trying to discern between the two?
- 6. As Mark tells us about the uniqueness of Jesus, what has encouraged you about his authority?

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.
