Sermon Questions

- 1. How did the inspired OT writers understand their own messianic content? Consider: When he called the king "God" (v. 6), "the psalmist was carried beyond himself, and ... he was led to employ [this language] by a twofold conviction in his mind, the conviction that God was the King of Israel, combined with the conviction that the Messiah, the true King, who was to be in reality what others were but in figure, was the son of David" (Perowne).
- 2. Compare this with Spurgeon's comment on Psalm 45: "Some see here Solomon and Pharaoh's daughter only- they are short-sighted; others see both Solomon and Christ- they are cross-eyed; well-focused spiritual eyes see Jesus only, or if Solomon be present at all, it must be like those hazy shadows of passers-by which cross the face of the camera, and therefore are dimly traceable upon a photographic landscape."
- 3. How is King Jesus different from earthly visions of an ideal king?
- 4. Consider the bridal gown you would be wearing were it to really show your faithfulness to your Betrothed. How deep and dark the stains, and how torn and tattered would it be? Now read verses 10-15 again, to see what the Groom sees.
- 5. Which gifts of the royal estate are you most excited to inherit? List all you can think of in grateful prayer this week.
