COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Matthew 6: 31-33

Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.

All: Lord, though you should guide us, we inform ourselves; though you should rule us, we control ourselves; though you should fulfill us, we console ourselves. SILENT CONFESSION OF SIN

DECLARATION OF GRACE: Ephesians 2:4-10

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved—and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Call to Confession We all sin daily, in thought and word and deed. As we come into God's presence, we acknowledge how we have rebelled against our King and seek his forgiveness.

*HOW DEEP THE FATHER'S LOVE FOR US

How deep the Father's love for us, how vast beyond all measure. That he should give his only Son to make a wretch his treasure. How great the pain of searing loss; the Father turns his face away; as wounds which mar the Chosen One bring many sons to glory.

Sermon Questions

- 1. In what way is anxiety a failure to live in the present?
- 2. Consider: "The uneasy conscience that many Christians have, and the anxiety based on it, do not come about because they are sinners and backsliders but because they have stopped believing in the truth and efficacy of their beliefs; they measure the power of faith by their own weakness; they project God's world into their own psychological make up instead of letting God measure them. They do something that Christians are for bidden to do: they observed faith from the outside; they doubt the power of hope; they deprive themselves of the power of love; and they lie down to rest in the chasm between the demands of Christianity and their own failure, in a chasm that, for a Christian, is no place at all."—Hans Urs von Balthasar
- 3. Why do we need to be careful to not just say to people: "Just stop being anxious"? What is the difference between accusation and offering hope?
