SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 John 1:5-8

# Advent: The Coming of the Son of Righteousness Guest Pastor John Sackett Hoping for Advent - Jeremiah 33:14-16 (ESV)

<sup>14</sup> "Behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. <sup>15</sup> In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David, and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. <sup>16</sup> In those days Judah will be saved, and Jerusalem will dwell securely. And this is the name by which it will be called: 'The LORD is our righteousness.'

# Sermon Outline

Often when we are overwhelmed we tend to lose sight of our Lord Jesus. Biblical HOPE reminds us of the reality that:

- 1. God is Good,
- 2. He is coming again
- 3. He will make all things (including us) right.

# **Sermon Questions**

- 1. Consider: "In short, the true application of prophetic truth is, that we never lay hold on, and really embrace the promises of God, except we look forward to the days that are coming, that is, except we patiently wait for the time prefixed by God: and further, except our faith leans on the promises, when they seem to be dormant, ..." (Calvin)
- 2. How should the connection between God's promise and his nature as a good God impact us?
- 3. What changes might we need to make, if we really believed Christ was coming again?
- 4. How does Christ change our identity?

### PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

# The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.
