Romans: Coming Under Grace Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. The Sin of the Religious - Romans 2:17-29 (ESV)

¹⁷ But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast in God ¹⁸ and know his will and approve what is excellent, because you are instructed from the law; 19 and if you are sure that you yourself are a guide to the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, ²⁰ an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of children, having in the law the embodiment of knowledge and truth—²¹ you then who teach others, do you not teach yourself? While you preach against stealing, do you steal? ²² You who say that one must not commit adultery, do you commit adultery? You who abhor idols, do you rob temples? ²³ You who boast in the law dishonor God by breaking the law. ²⁴ For, as it is written, "The name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you."

²⁵ For circumcision indeed is of value if you obey the law, but if you break the law, your circumcision becomes uncircumcision. ²⁶ So, if a man who is uncircumcised keeps the precepts of the law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision? ²⁷ Then he who is physically uncircumcised but keeps the law will condemn you who have the written code and circumcision but break the law. ²⁸ For no one is a Jew who is merely one outwardly, nor is circumcision outward and physical. ²⁹ But a Jew is one inwardly, and circumcision is a matter of the heart, by the Spirit, not by

the letter. His praise is not from man but from God.

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith. and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Consider: "The purpose of Romans is the glory of God seen in a united missionary church humbled together under grace."—Christopher Ash. How does this section (2:17-29) contribute to this statement?
- 2. What role does this section have in Paul's overall argument?
- 3. You could say that Paul here is taking on the "elder brother's" self-righteousness. How can we use the things of God to keep us from the heart of God?
- 4. Why is it important to remember that Paul is not talking about individual Jews, but about Jewish confidence collectively in their status as belonging to the covenant?
- 5. How does the sin highlighted here by the Jews get lived out by religious people everywhere? How do our actions demonstrate the real intent of our hearts?

God Communes with Us
