Sermon Questions

- 1. Jesus says three divisions of the Hebrew scriptures speak of him. What is he actually implying?
- 2. What is significant about Jesus referring back to the scriptures about his resurrection and not the disciples' experience of his resurrection?
- 3. Jesus makes an audacious claim about who he is "the Bible is about him." How does this speak of his divinity?
- 4. There are specific prophecies about Jesus and there are general themes of redemption which speak of him. Why is it important not to forget the general themes (hint: the book of Hebrews)?
- 5. The suffering of the Messiah was anticipated in Psalms 22; 31;69; 118; Isaiah 53. Why did no one grasp this teaching in Jesus' day? What causes people to struggle today with the message of the gospel?

The Lord's Supper

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
