Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Notice how the psalmist describes himself and other believers humble, poor, brokenhearted, crushed in spirit. How do these conditions (or your awareness of them) promote gratitude and praise?
- 2. Spurgeon said that Psalm 34 begins with a hymn and ends with a sermon. Where is the division and how are the two parts related to each other?
- 3. Who are "the righteous" in the psalm (vv. 15, 17, 19, 21)? Are they delivered *because* they are righteous?
- 4. Think about how Peter uses the wisdom of Psalm 34 to encourage believers who are suffering in 1 Peter 3:8-17.
- 5. Commenting on verse 10, Peter Craigie says that the young lions, because of their age and position in the food chain, "symbolize the essence of self-sufficiency in the provision of physical needs. In contrast, those who fear the LORD are not self-sufficient; they depend on another, God, for the provision of their basic needs." Has age or weakness taught you the grace of dependence on God? Has your vigor hindered that lesson?

Children's Question

Are you proud of how good you are, or do you boast in what God has done for you? In what ways can you celebrate God's goodness to you? (vv. 2-3)

*THERE IS A LAND OF PURE DELIGHT

There is a land of pure delight, where saints, immortal reign. Infinite day excludes the night and pleasures banish pain.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

*CORNERSTONE

My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the sweetest frame but wholly trust in Jesus' name. (*Repeat*)

Christ alone, Cornerstone;
Weak made strong in the Savior's love;
Through the storm he is Lord, Lord of all.

When darkness seems to hide his face, I rest on his unchanging grace. In every high and stormy gale, my anchor holds within the veil; (Chorus)

When he shall come with trumpet sound, Oh may I then in him be found, dressed in his righteousness alone, faultless to stand before the throne. (Chorus 2x)
