Sermon Questions

- 1. What is significant about the Lord waiting until Pentecost for this outpouring to happen?
- 2. The book of Acts does not teach us about an elevation of the interior spiritual life of believers through the Spirit, nor does it teach a 'second blessing' of the Spirit given to some but not all believers. What then is the focus of the book of Acts?
- 3. The Holy Spirit both empowers those proclaiming the gospel and gives understanding (illumination) to the hearers of that gospel message. How is this an encouragement for you in sharing the gospel with others?
- 4. What are the OT significances of the three symbols: wind, fire, and languages?
- 5. How is Jesus the center of the story in Pentecost? How is Jesus to be the center of the story in our lives?

Children's Question

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit opened the door for people to come to Jesus. How are we to be a part of bringing people to Jesus?
