Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Sermon Questions

- 1. When was that last time you felt your "soul thirst for God"?
- 2. Why do you suppose the writer of this psalm felt desperate for worship?
- 3. What was his reaction to the spiritual drought in his life?
- 4. What is similar about the times of drought and the times where we are in a deluge?
- 5. There is a frankness and honesty in the prayers in this psalm; does that characterize your prayer life? If not, why not?
- 6. What was the writer praying for? Is this a regularly a theme of your prayers?

Children's Question

What about coming to church do you love? Why do we worship God? If we can worship God outside of the church, what makes worship in the church special or important?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
