God Calls Us

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 25:8-10, 12-14

Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way. All the paths of the LORD are steadfast love and faithfulness, for those who keep his covenant and his testimonies ...Who is the man who fears the LORD? Sermon Questions

- 1. What the false teaching presented to the Colossians was nothing more than a parody of the truth. What Christ alone offers them is the real thing. Why is the parody always so appealing to us?
- 2. What does it meant to say that living for Christ by denying our lives is to be part of our baptismal life? (cf. 2 Cor 4:10-11, Rom 6:4)
- 3. What does it mean that our lives our hidden in Christ? Looking at Colossians 1:9-14 again, Where does Paul place the emphasis? How does this keep us from moralism (I must do so that God will bless me)?
- 4. If what Paul is saying is so clear and easy, why do we struggle so much living it out? Look back to question #1. Do you think that techniques, "new insights", and following the correct steps is a way for us not to really deal with our hearts? How does the gospel make keep our hearts front and center?
- 5. Why does the truth of this passage make us learn to live with disappointment, hurt, and even some confusion in this life? How does it also call us beyond this to live a life that seeks after Christ in all things?

Children's Question

What does it mean to have Jesus at the center of my life? How does that work in day to day things like going to school and playing outside?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith. and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.
