God Calls Us

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 37:3-5, 8-9

Trust in the LORD, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness. Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart. Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act. Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil. For the evildoers shall be cut off, but those who wait for the LORD shall inherit the land.

II. Servant of the Word of God

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith. and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Paul ties his suffering for the gospel directly to Christ's sufferings. What does he mean by this? In what way can he speak of Christ's suffering lacking?
- 2. Read 2 Timothy 2:8-12; Phil 3:10-11; 2 Cr 4:7-15 and Acts 9:16. Paul understands that a part of his calling as an apostle is to share in the sufferings of Christ on behalf of others. What would motivate Paul to have this attitude toward others?
- 3. Consider: "The church has forgotten how to apply to itself the fact that it is the body of the crucified Messiah"—N.T. Wright. How should we suffer with a purpose as Christians?
- 4. What is significant about Paul using the word "mystery" two times in such a short span? How does Paul make the word of God known?
- 5. What does it mean to have God's empowering grace for ministering the gospel?
