Colossians Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Clothes That Fit — Colossians 3:5-17 (ESV)

⁵Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ¹¹Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

¹² Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, ¹³ bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. ¹⁵ And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. ¹⁶ Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Why is it so important to keep in mind the "already but not yet" nature of our faith when it comes to how we behave? What happens when we get this wrong?
- 2. Consider: "Being a Christian is less about cautiously avoiding sin than about courageously and actively doing God's will."— Dietrich Bonhoeffer. How is this a greater motivation for the life of a believer? Why do we often settle for just avoiding sin?
- 3. Consider: "There is only one genuine cure for legalism. it is the same medicine the gospel prescribes for [lawlessness]: understanding and tasting union with Jesus Christ himself. This leads to a new love for and obedience to the law of God"—Sinclair Ferguson. How does this explain the good news of Jesus Christ both to the self-righteous and to the self-loathing?
- 4. Consider: "Forgiveness is love surviving sin. That is what forgiveness is: love surmounting sin. And love that survives sin is a higher, deeper, more beautiful love than anything Adam and Eve ever knew or could have known before the Fall. There is a greater love to be practiced in the Christian life than any other love in the world." —Dr. Rayburn. By this standard, how is your love for others doing?
- 5. Forgiveness is a gift to give and not a demand to make. What the Lord may require of us is not the right for others to demand of us. Have you ever demanded someone forgive you? What was your motive for doing so? Were you trying to control their response?

Children's Question

Belonging to Jesus really looks different.

People can see the amazing love of Jesus come from you to them.

How does this encourage you to live for Jesus even when people are not nice to you?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith. and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)
