LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Advent: Rend the Heavens Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. How Can We Be Redeemed? — Isaiah 61:1-3, 10-11 (ESV)

The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to bring good news to the poor; he has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound;

² to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

³ to grant to those who mourn in Zion—

to give them a beautiful headdress instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit; that they may be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that he may be glorified.

¹⁰ I will greatly rejoice in the LORD; my soul shall exult in my God, for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation; he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself like a priest with a beautiful headdress, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.
¹¹ For as the earth brings forth its sprouts, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to sprout up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to sprout up before all the nations.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Compare Isaiah 11:1-5 with Is 61:1-3. What are some similarities? How do these two passages act as book ends for Isaiah? In Is 61, one of the primary ways the Messiah works is through speaking and proclaiming. What does that tells us about his person and his work? (think also of John 1:1). How does a proclamation set people free?
- 2. In Luke 4:18-19, Jesus reads this portion of Isaiah's prophecy and declares that he is its fulfillment. Where does Jesus stop at in the Isaiah passage? What is significant about that?
- 3. In the OT, the place where the filling of the Holy Spirit and anointing are spoken of together are in the kingship of Saul and David (1 Sam 10:1, 6-7; 1 Sam 16:13; 2 Sam 23:1-2). What does this tells us about the Messiah? Christians have referred to Jesus as Prophet, Priest and King. Discuss Westminster Shorter Catechism questions 23-26.
- 4. In vs 10-11, we see that praise and thanksgiving are the natural response to God's grace. Thanksgiving flows from a heart which has received grace. How does a lack of gratitude or thanksgiving indicate someone has not comprehended God's grace and mercy?
- 5. Consider this quote: "Here is another great paradox of the Bible: try to make ourselves mighty, and we burn ourselves up; admit ourselves as helpless and doomed, and God gives us his beauty. We are made to be mirrors; when his beauty is reflected in us, we become beautiful." John Oswalt. How is this an encouragement to you? In what areas of your 'mirror' would you like prayer?
- 6. What does an "oak of righteousness, the planting of the Lord" signify or symbolize? Look at Is 1:29-31 and Is 60:21. How do these contrasting images express Isaiah's message?
- 7. Would you say your life is marked by joy? Why or why not? How does this passage instruct us on biblical joy?

Children's Question

What about the hope of Jesus fills you with joy?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)
