The Apostle's Creed

The Apostle's Creed is an ancient summary of what Christians believe. By confessing the Creed in worship, we are uniting with all of God's people in our common faith in Christ. We joyfully declare who we are while we remember what truly matters. The word "catholic" is a Greek word that simply means 'universal'. It speaks of all Christians everywhere.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Throughout history, Christians have been at the forefront of helping their neighbors in times of crisis. What is it about our hope in Christ that helps us see beyond difficult circumstances? What are personal challenges for you in doing this?
- 2. What does it means to "preach the gospel to ourselves"? How can you help do that for yourself and for others?
- 3. Consider: "The uneasy conscience that many Christians have, and the anxiety based on it, do not come about because they are sinners and backsliders but because they have stopped believing in the truth and efficacy of their beliefs; they measure the power of faith by their own weakness; they project God's world into their own psychological make up instead of letting God measure them. They do something that Christians are for bidden to do: they observed faith from the outside; they doubt the power of hope; they deprive themselves of the power of love; and they lie down to rest in the chasm between the demands of Christianity and their own failure, in a chasm that, for a Christian, is no place at all. Is it any wonder that anxiety seizes them on account of this placelessness."—Hans Urs von Balthasar
- 4. Why do we need to be careful to not just say to people: "Just stop being anxious"? What is the difference between accusation and offering hope?
- 5. The Lord has made us for community. In times when that is restricted, we need to be creative. Share creative ideas with one another. Share the peace of Christ with one another and take this time to broaden your circle.

Sermon

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
