The Apostle's Creed

The Apostle's Creed is an ancient summary of what Christians believe. By confessing the Creed in worship, we are uniting with all of God's people in our common faith in Christ. We joyfully declare who we are while we remember what truly matters. The word "catholic" is a Greek word that simply means 'universal'. It speaks of all Christians everywhere.

Before the throne of God above I have a strong and perfect plea, a great High Priest whose name is Love, who ever lives and pleads for me. My name is graven on his hands, My name is written on his heart; I know that while in heav'n he stands no tongue can bid me thence depart, no tongue can bid me thence depart.

Sermon Series: The Throne of David — 2 Chronicles Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Amaziah the Also-ran — 2 Chronicles 25 (ESV)

Amaziah was twenty-five years old when he began to reign, and he reigned twenty nine years in Jerusalem. ² And he did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, yet not with a whole heart. ³ And as soon as the royal power was firmly his, he killed his servants who had struck down the king his father. ⁴ But he did not put their children to death, according to what is written in the Law, in the Book of Moses, where the Lord commanded, "Fathers shall not die because of their children, nor children die because of their fathers, but each one shall die for his own sin."

⁵ Then Amaziah assembled the men of Judah and ... he mustered those twenty years old and upward ... fit for war ... ⁶ He hired ... mighty men of valor from Israel ... ⁷ But a man of God came to him and said, "O king, do not let the army of Israel go with you, for the Lord is not with Israel, with all these Ephraimites. ⁸ But go, act, be strong for the battle. Why should you suppose that God will cast you down before the enemy? For God has power to help or to cast down." ⁹ And Amaziah said to the man of God, "But what shall we do about the hundred talents that I have given to the army of Israel?" The man of God answered, "The Lord is able to give you much more than this." ¹⁰ Then Amaziah discharged the army that had come to him from Ephraim to go home again. And they became very angry with Judah and returned home in fierce anger.

¹⁴ After Amaziah came from striking down the Edomites, he brought the gods of the men of Seir and set them up as his gods and worshiped them, making offerings to them. ¹⁵ Therefore the Lord was angry with Amaziah and sent to him a prophet, who said to him, "Why have you sought the gods of a people who did not deliver their own people from your hand?" ¹⁶ But as he was speaking, the king said to him, "Have we made you a royal counselor? Stop! Why should you be struck down?" So the prophet stopped, but said, "I know that God has determined to destroy you, because you have done this and have not listened to my counsel."

Sermon Questions

- 1. The first of assessment of Amaziah is mediocre at best. Compare and contrast his two responses to the prophets sent to him. What might account for the difference?
- 2. A high place was a site used for religious purposes. It could be elevated location but not always. Sometimes Israel worshipped the Lord at these places, sometimes other gods. What made them such a problem for Israel? Why do you think it was so hard for people to want to remove them? Where do you see this struggle in your own life?
- 3. Consider: "Even when amends have been made, mistakes sometimes cast long shadows down the corridors of human life." —L. Allen. This describes Amaziah's botched attempt to hire Israelite mercenaries and its consequences. How have you seen this at work in your own life at times?
- 4. In what way is v-20 a sober reminder of God's sovereign rule over his people? What does it mean that repentance is a gift and not an obligation of God (2 Tim 2:25)?
- 5. When we think of Jesus, the great king, we see that he goes the distance. "It is finished." How does the gospel encourage us in a life of faithfulness?

Children's Question

When we listen to the God's Word, we listen to all of it and not just the parts we like.

Jesus asks us to obey his commandments. How does his love for you
encourage you to obey even when you don't really want to?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

The Lord's Supper

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
