Sermon Series: Palm Sunday Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Is That It?! — Matthew 21:1-9 (ESV)

I. The Smallness of Our Expectations

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

II. The Wonder of Christ's Reality

Sermon Questions

- 1. The people thought they understood who and what the Messiah was to be; yet Jesus did things that defied their understanding of Messiah and offended them. What were some of those differences? Why is this important to keep in mind when we attempt to move our eyes off of ourselves and onto Jesus?
- 2. Speaking of Jesus as God, Augustine says of the triumphal entry: "He does not lose his divinity when he teaches us humility." In what way is the glory of God revealed in Jesus' humble entrance into Jerusalem?
- 3. Disappointments are hard to take by anyone; yet the Lord calls us to trust him in the midst of them —to walk by faith and not by sight. How has Jesus helped you with this in your own life?
- 4. Letting go of our expectations for what we think our lives should be, or how our family should have turned out is a death of sorts. In many ways, following Jesus produces a series of mini-deaths in our lives. Where have you struggled with not liking the plan of your life? How have you responded to the Lord for this?

- 5. Consider Dietrich Bonhoeffer: "Cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our Church. We are fighting today for costly grace. Cheap grace means grace sold on the market like cheap goods ... Cheap grace is the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession ... Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ, living and incarnate."
- 6. Does Jesus' invitation to death keep you at arms length or do you step forward (by his grace) to die to something with the hope of resurrection before you?
- 7. Jesus promises his people freedom from sin and death in the coming of his Kingdom. Why do we so often try and add to the benefit package in this life? How is biblical worship an antidote for this tendency?

Children's Question

We often don't get what we want and things can happen differently than what we expected. How does Jesus help us with our disappointments?
