Sermon Series: The Throne of David—2 Chronicles Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Josiah: When Your Best Isn't Good Enough 2 Chronicles 34-35

¹ Josiah was eight years old when he began to reign, and he reigned thirty-one years in Jerusalem. ² And he did what was right in the eyes of the LORD, and walked in the ways of David his father; and he did not turn aside to the right hand or to the left. ³ For in the eighth year of his reign, while he was yet a boy, he began to seek the God of David his father, and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem of the high places, the Asherim, and the carved and the metal images ...

Now in the eighteenth year of his reign, when he had cleansed the land and the house, he sent Shaphan ... to repair the house of the LORD his God ... ¹⁴ Hilkiah the priest found the Book of the Law of the LORD given through Moses. ¹⁵ Then Hilkiah answered and said to Shaphan the secretary, "I have found the Book of the

Law in the house of the LORD."

²⁰ And the king commanded Hilkiah ... saying, ²¹ "Go, inquire of the LORD for me and for those who are left in Israel and in Judah, concerning the words of the book that has been found. For great is the wrath of the LORD that is poured out on us, because our fathers have not kept the word of the LORD, to do according to all that is written in this book."

²² So Hilkiah and those whom the king had sent went to Huldah the prophetess, ... ²³ And she said to them, "Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: 'Tell the man who sent you to me, ²⁴ Thus says the LORD, Behold, I will bring disaster upon this place and upon its inhabitants, all the curses that are written in the book that was read before the king of Judah. ²⁵ Because they have forsaken me and have made offerings to other gods, that they might provoke me to anger with all the works of their hands, therefore my wrath will be poured out on this place and will not be quenched. ²⁶ But to the king of Judah, who sent you to inquire of the LORD, thus shall you say to him, Thus says the LORD, the God of Israel: Regarding the words that you have heard, ²⁷ because your heart was tender and you humbled yourself before God when you heard his words against this place and its inhabitants, and you have humbled yourself before me and have torn your clothes and wept before me, I also have heard you, declares the LORD. ²⁸ Behold, I will gather you to your fathers, and you shall be gathered to your grave in peace, and your eyes shall not see all the disaster that I will bring upon this place and its inhabitants."

- 2. What is encouraging about Josiah's young and strong faith?
- 3. In what way was Josiah's death similar to King Ahab (2 Chronicles 18:33)? What do we learn of God's sovereignty in this?
- 4. The wisdom of Solomon was not enough. The care of the temple by Hezekiah was not enough. Josiah's obedience to the Torah was not enough. As great as Josiah was, he could not save Judah from exile. How does Josiah prepare Israel for the Messiah?
- 5. How does the Apostle Paul remind us of the limits of the Law? (hint: Gal 3:21-22; Rom 8:3-4)
