COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 95:8-11

Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness, when your fathers put me to the test and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work. For forty years I loathed that generation and said, "They are a people who go astray in their heart, and they have not known my ways." Therefore I swore in my wrath, "They shall not enter my rest."

All: O Lord, the great and awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and keep his commandments, we have sinned and done wrong and acted wickedly and rebelled, turning aside from your commandments and rules. To you, O Lord, belongs righteousness, but to us open shame. To the Lord our God belong mercy and forgiveness, for we have rebelled against him and have not obeyed the voice of the LORD our God by walking in his ways, O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive. Sermon Questions

- 1. In this Psalm what are all the attributes or accomplishments mentioned, or hinted at, regarding the King?
- 2. This Psalm begins with an invitation to action: "Clap your hands ... shout to God". Do you feel comfortable with these types of expressions in worship? Why or why not?
- 3. Verse 7 includes the phrase "sing praises with a psalm". "Psalm" here is the Hebrew word "Maskil" which carries the meaning of "wisdom" and/or "skill". How should that inform our singing in worship?
- 4. Derek Kidner states that this psalm is "more than poetry: this is prophecy, whose climax is exceptionally far-reaching." How is this prophetic? How is it far reaching?

Children's Question

When was the last time you shouted with gladness? What made you that happy? Have you ever shouted for joy about Jesus?
