Sermon Questions

- 1. What do we learn about Joseph and Mary as they come for the rite of purification?
- 2. Simeon was waiting for the consolation of Israel, yet it seems others (even the disciples?) were hoping for a conquering king. Why the disconnect?
- 3. Simeon had also been promised he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Christ. How would that focus and purpose affect one's life? Is there a similar vision we can have?
- 4. The blessing to Mary is certainly curious. We can only imagine how a young mother would hear these words, yet Simeon is perfectly on point with all he speaks. How might God's word been an encouragement even if difficult to hear?

Children's Question

Have you ever seen anyone so full of joy at seeing a baby? That's how Simeon is when he sees the baby Jesus; he's full of joy. God had promised that Simeon wouldn't die until he has seen the Messiah. All his life he had been waiting to see his Savior. Now the day had come. How can you grow that kind of joy in your heart for Jesus?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.
