Sermon Series: Hebrews — Finish the Race Pastor John Sackett. Unbelief: Warning and Remedy — Hebrews 3:12–19 (ESV)

¹² Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. ¹³ But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. ¹⁴ For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. ¹⁵ As it is said,

"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion." ¹⁶ For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses? ¹⁷ And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? ¹⁸ And to whom did he swear that they would not enter his rest, but to those who were disobedient? ¹⁹ So we see that they were unable to enter because of unbelief.

Sermon Questions

- 1. Why does the writer of Hebrews call an unbelieving heart "evil"?
- 2. Consider: "Sin uses the cloak of deceit with devastating effect on those inclined to fall under its spell (Donald Guthrie)." Do we really believe that sin devastates?
- 3. Lane notes that in these verses we see a "shocking truth". He continues "... a participant in the redemption provided by God can choose to disbelieve God. [And] It is possible to display unpardonable indifference to the promise of God."
- 4. We are called to exhort one another. Who exhorts you? Who do you exhort? What are your goals for them and theirs for you?
- 5. On these verses Calvin remarks, "Unless our faith is repeatedly encouraged, it lies dormant; unless it be warmed, it will be frozen; unless it is aroused, it will grow numb." In what ways can we avail ourselves to encouragements for our faith?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Children's Question

Our Scripture passage speaks about a "hard heart". What makes a heart hard, and how would a person with a hard heart act? What can we do to grow a soft heart?

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
