God Calls Us

The Lord summons his people to worship and we respond in obedience. The Lord's call is a call to action. We gather, praise, adore, give thanks, etc. The Call to Worship is a joyful summons and a clear reminder that worship is our coming into God's presence by his command, and not our command that He come into our presence.

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: *Judges 2:7, 10-11*

And the people served the LORD all the days of Joshua, and all the days of the elders who outlived Joshua, who had seen all the great work that the LORD had done for Israel. Sermon Series: Summer Psalms & Proverbs

The Judge Speaks — Psalm 50 (ESV)

The Mighty One, God the Lord, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting. ² Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth. ³ Our God comes; he does not keep silence; before him is a devouring fire, around him a mighty tempest. ⁴ He calls to the heavens above and to the earth, that he may judge his people: ⁵ “Gather to me my faithful ones, who made a covenant with me by sacrifice!”

⁶ The heavens declare his righteousness, for God himself is judge! *Selah*

⁷ “Hear, O my people, and I will speak; O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God. ... ¹² “If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and its fullness are mine. ¹³ Do I eat the flesh of bulls or drink the blood of goats? ¹⁴ Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and perform your vows to the Most High, ¹⁵ and call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me.”

¹⁶ But to the wicked God says: “What right have you to recite my statutes or take my covenant on your lips? ... ²² “Mark this, then, you who forget God, lest I tear you apart, and there be none to deliver! ²³ The one who offers thanksgiving as his sacrifice glorifies me; to one who orders his way rightly I will show the salvation of God!”

Sermon Questions?

1. Does the imagery here of God appearing (as He did at Mt Sinai) help you to see Him in His glory? When was the last time you were struck with a sense of His glory?
2. Why does God assemble the world, yet only seems to speak to Israel?
3. Vs 14 and vs 23 speak of “a sacrifice of thanksgiving” – what would that look like for you? How is your thanksgiving to God sacrificial?
4. One scholar remarks this passage gives Christians an opportunity to reflect on “the demanding implications of enjoying a still better covenant (of Heb 7:22)”. What are the demanding implications for you?
