COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: James 2:10

John 5

Sermon Questions

- 1. The return of Jesus is to bring renewal to heaven and earth. We are not "whisked" away to heaven, rather Jesus returns to bring heaven on earth. How does this perspective help us to not to retreat or escape from the problems we currently face?
- 2. The New Testament speaks about a bodily resurrection repeatedly yet many only think about a continuing spiritual existence. What might be some ways to correct this?
- 3. Consider: "History will not simply run its course, but under the guidance of God will come to a consummation. His purposes will be fulfilled in the end." M. Erickson. How is this a source of encouragement to you?
- 4. How might you respond to someone who fears heaven will be "boring"?

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

At Faith Covenant, the Lord's Supper is observed each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body, the Church. By eating the bread and drinking the cup with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with God. You also acknowledge that you are a sinner, without hope except in the sovereign mercy of God, and that you are trusting in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation. If you have any doubts about your participation, please speak to the pastor or one of the elders after the service. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.
