COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Mark 12:30-31

And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these.

Sermon Series: I Corinthians — Living in the Mess Pastor Lloyd Pierson All A Gift — I Corinthians 4:1-7 (ESV)

This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. ² Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. ³ But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. ⁴ For I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me. ⁵ Therefore do not pronounce judgment before the time, before the Lord comes, who will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Then each one will receive his commendation from God.

- 1. How does Paul correct their problem of being divisive about church leaders in 4:1-7?
- 2. Some might view verse 3 as an arrogant statement by Paul. What does he say that exonerates him from this charge?
- 3. What does Paul mean when he says not to go beyond what is written? What are examples of that?
- 4. In verse 4, how does our conscience fit in with what Paul is talking about here?
- 5. Consider: "No room is left for taking pride in ourselves, when it is by God's grace we are what we are." Calvin. How is this the very heart of humility?

Children's Question

What does it mean to be humble? Thinking we are better than others or looking down on them comes from a proud heart. How does God's gift of grace keep us humble?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
