Sermon Questions

- 1. The Corinthians are called upon to an entire new way of doing business because they are now a new community in Christ. What areas are we called upon to express this new community which cuts against our culture?
- 2. Judging the angels and the world are difficult to fully understand here. It is hard to know is Paul quoting back some of their phrases or if he is highlighting a Christian teaching. What is Paul's main point either way?
- 3. Criminal cases and civil cases are to be handled differently by Christians. What are examples of where the church is to hand over judgement to the governing authorities?
- 4. Why is the reputation of the church important to maintain in any society? We do not hide sins in order to maintain reputation. How does being a safe place for sinners but not a safe place for sin give us a good way forward?
- 5. A new identity in Christ should bring new behaviors. How might you respond to someone who thinks this is too idealistic? What does it mean to speak of "floor" and "ceiling" ethics?

Children's Question

When someone wrongs us, we are mad and upset. How does Jesus instruct us to deal with our hearts when we don't like being wronged?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
