COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: James 2:10

For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it.

Leader: You shall have no other gods before me.

Leader: You shall not make for yourself a carved image...You shall not bow down to them or serve them.

All: But I make you into who I want you to be.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. In Luke 9:23-26, Jesus speaks on what it means to be a disciple-ship. This has always been a challenge to every time and culture. What are some specific challenges we face today?
- 2. Consider: "The claim of Jesus is a total and exclusive one. It does not allow a convenient compartmentalization of natural life and religious life, of secular and sacred. The whole person stands under Christ's claim." —J. R. Edwards. What are challenges for you in integrating your natural and religious life?
- 3. J.O.Y—Jesus first, then Others, then Yourself. We all struggle with reversing the order. What are things you can do to help make this order a rhythm and pattern in your life?
- 4. Consider: "What we're talking about is the Christian life. It's following Jesus. Spirituality is no different from what we've been doing for two thousand years just by going to church and receiving the sacraments, being baptized, learning to pray, and reading Scriptures rightly. It's just ordinary stuff."—Eugene Peterson. Why is doing the "ordinary" stuff so hard for us that we want to find the "extra-special" stuff to fill our life of faith?
- 5. Knowing who Jesus is shapes how we follow him. How do we know who he is?

Children's Question

Jesus calls us to follow him completely. How is this a challenge to you when you just want to live for yourself?

God Consecrates Us

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
