God Calls Us

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Romans 6

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?...If we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. Therefore, do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as instruments of wickedness, but rather to God.

All: Our good and glorious God, you are holy and just; yet we are poor sinners. Our words are often instruments of wickedness, and we offer ourselves to the pleasures of sin. Father, forgive us, we pray, for hearts that are unmoved by your mercy, for hearts that avoid dying with Christ. Forgive us for allowing sin to reign in us. By the power of your Spirit, produce in us the fruits of holiness and righteousness, pleasing in your sight. Enable us to offer ourselves fully to you through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

DECLARATION OF GRACE: Romans 5:8-10

God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life.

The Apostle's Creed

The Apostle's Creed is an ancient summary of what Christians believe. By confessing the Creed in worship, we are uniting with all of God's people in our common faith in Christ. We joyfully declare who we are while we remember what truly matters. The word "catholic" is a Greek word that simply means 'universal'. It speaks of all Christians everywhere.

*IN CHRIST ALONE

In Christ alone my hope is found, he is my light, my strength, my song;
This cornerstone, this solid ground,
firm through the fiercest drought and storm.
What heights of love, what depths of peace,
when fears are stilled, when strivings cease!
My Comforter, my all in all, here in the love of Christ I stand.

In Christ alone who took on flesh, fullness of God in helpless babe! This gift of love and righteousness, scorned by the ones he came to save; Till on that cross as Jesus died, the wrath of God was satisfied For ev'ry sin on him was laid; here in the death of Christ I live.

¹But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ²And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. ⁵And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁵that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." ⁶And they remembered his words, ⁰and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹¹ONow it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, ¹¹¹but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹¹²But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves and he went home marveling at what had happened.

Because Jesus was raised by the power of the father, we have been enabled to walk in Christ's victory.

Sermon Questions

- 1. How did the resurrection vindicate the mission of Jesus?
- 2. Why do you think the disciples did not believe the women who said Jesus was risen? Even so, Peter ran to the tomb. What might account for this?
- 3. Simon Wiesenthal was asked by a dying S.S. soldier to forgive him for the evil he committed against the Jewish people. He walked away from the soldier without saying anything. He later asks the question: "What should I have done?" What in the gospel provides an answer to this question?
- 4. All that Jesus accomplishes for his people is an act of supernatural grace. Why must we always remember that grace comes from God to us? The message of the resurrection is the supremacy of God. In what ways do people try and steal some of his glory?
- 5. What can give someone who has been so horribly wronged the power to forgive?

Children's Question

How does having your sins forgiven by the Lord, enable you to extend grace to those who have sinned against you?

God Consecrates Us Consecrate

Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's people.

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
