COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 John 3:16-18

If anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

Sermon Series—Numbers: A Pilgrim People Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. I Will Bless You: Numbers 22-25

Numbers 22:

⁴...So Balak the son of Zippor, who was king of Moab at that time, ⁵sent messengers to Balaam the son of Beor ...saying, "Behold, a people has come out of Egypt. They cover the face of the earth, and they are dwelling opposite me. ⁶Come now, curse this people for me, since they are too mighty for me. Perhaps I shall be able to defeat them and drive them from the land, for I know that he whom you bless is blessed, and he whom you curse is cursed." ⁷So the elders of Moab and the elders of Midian departed with the fees for divination in their hand. And they came to Balaam and gave him Balak's message. ... ¹²God said to Balaam, "You shall not go with them. You shall not curse the people, for they are blessed." ¹³So Balaam rose in the morning and said to the princes of Balak, "Go to your own land, for the Lord has refused to let me go with you." ¹⁴So the princes of Moab rose and went to Balak and said, "Balaam refuses to come with us."

The Lord cares for his people and he chooses to bless them even when they fail to see or grasp the height and the depth of his love.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. Consider: "Read the story of Balaam and skip over the donkey episode and you might well come away with the impression that Balaam is a good, upstanding man, perhaps even a righteous one." How does the donkey episode expose Balaam as the Seer who does not see? How does Balaam and his donkey mirror Balak and Balaam?
- 2. The Lord seems to change his mind by allowing Balaam to go to Moab. What literary clues are given to show us this is not the case? How do we muddle up what God has made clear?
- 3. We see Balaam again in Numbers 31:8 & 16. How does the sin of Israel in Numbers 25 connect to Balaam? (cf. 2 Peter 2:15, Revelations 2:14). In the end, the Lord thwarts the attempt to curse his people, but Israel is done in by run-of-the-mill sin. What are some takeaways for us in this?
- 4. What do we learn of God's unconditional love for his people here? How does Jesus bring God's blessing to his people? What is the difference between "means of grace" and "means to grace"?

Children's Question

How does Jesus laying down his life help answer the problems we have with God judging sin?
