COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 John 1:5-7

This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin.

Sermon Series—Pentecost Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Brought Together in Christ: Genesis II & Acts 2

Gen 11:1-9

¹Now the whole earth had one language and the same words... ⁴Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth." 5And the LORD came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. ⁶And the LORD said, "Behold, they are one people, and they have all one language, and this is only the beginning of what they will do. And nothing that they propose to do will now be impossible for them. ⁷Come, let us go down and there confuse their language, so that they may not understand one another's speech." ⁸So the LORD dispersed them from there over the face of all the earth, and they left off building the city. ⁹Therefore its name was called Babel, because there the LORD confused the language of all the earth. Sermon

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. In what way does the account of Babel give us a picture of fallen humanity throughout history?
- 2. How does the Holy Spirit reunify humanity? How does this allow for a great deal of diversity?
- 3. If we are to live out our calling as a people unified in Christ Jesus, what challenges will we face when we think of the fractured nature of the Church? How might having unity for the sake of the gospel cost you personally?
- 4. How does Pentecost transforms the ministry of Christ into the mission of the Church?
- 5. Following Jesus moves us from outsiders to insiders. What areas of struggle are they for you when you now deal with "outsiders" in the world? What about the nature of grace overcomes this?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
